WHY TSA EXISTS

“Aviation and Transportation Security Act” (Nov. 2001)

“(d) FUNCTIONS.—The TSA... shall be responsible for security in all modes of transportation, including—

“(1) carrying out chapter 449, relating to civil aviation security, and related research and development activities; and

“(2) security responsibilities over other modes of transportation that are exercised by the Department of Transportation.”



Highway & Motor Carrier

Vision – to enhance the security posture of the national highway transportation sector through a comprehensive approach while working closely with all our highway industry security stakeholders.

Mission – to enhance security through a risk-based approach to prevent terrorist attacks, protect highway assets, systems and people, and improve resiliency of the trucking, motorcoach, infrastructure and school transportation industries.

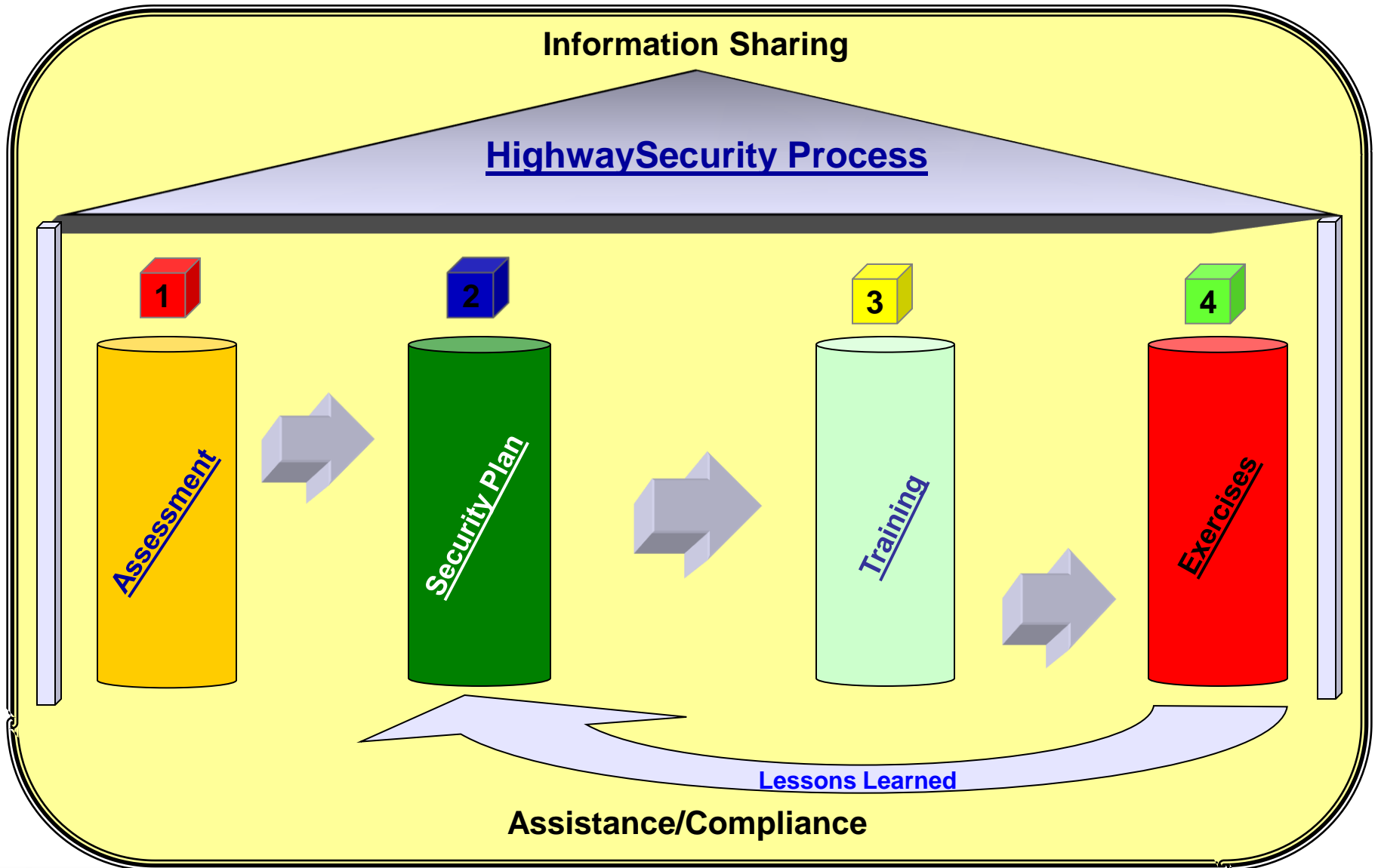


School Bus

- U.S. domestic groups with secular, political, or anarchist motivations

Targets

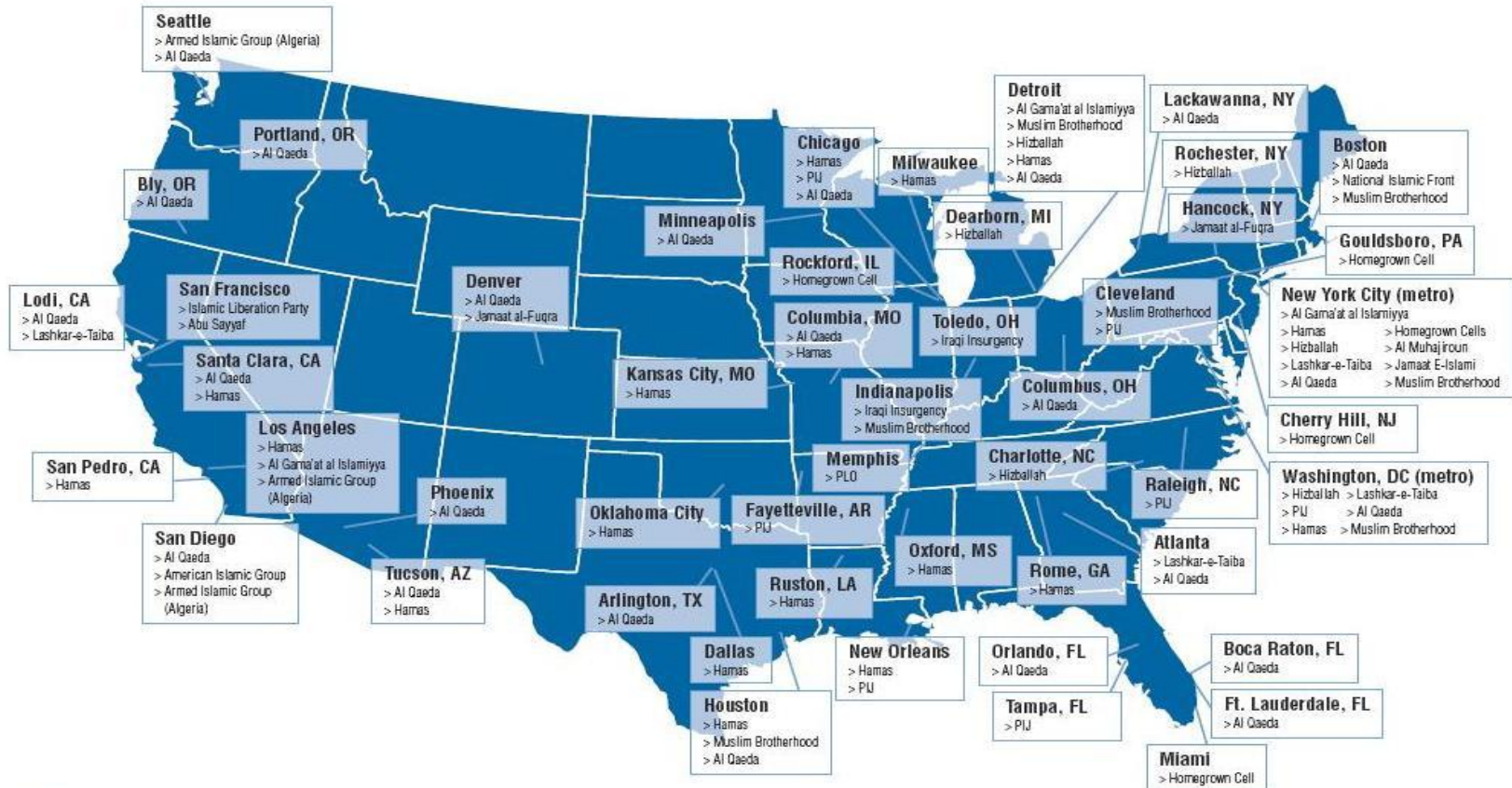
- Buses and Bridges
